PILOT INTERNATIONAL HEADQUARTERS DEDICATION

Over 450 Pilot members attended the ribbon cutting and dedication of the Pilot International Headquarters in Macon, GA on February 9th. Construction on the \$2 million facility began in January 2007 and was completed by Thanksgiving. About \$1 million was contributions from Pilot members. Christine Shirley, 92, attended the dedication and was also at the dedication (1965) of the original headquarters. President Judy Breaud filled a time capsule with the dedication program and other Pilot artifacts. The capsule will be buried in the Heritage Gardens, which are still under construction. The capsule is to be opened in 63 years, which will be Pilots 150 anniversary.

FLORIDA PILOTS WERE THERE!

More than 400 members of the Pilot International service organization helped unveil the group's new headquarters in Macon, Ga. on February 8th. Coming from clubs as far as Arizona, Canada and the Bahamas, members said the grand opening of the nearly \$2 million facility felt like a homecoming.

"This beautiful building represents the vision and dreams of very dedicated and caring Pilots," said Judy Breaud, Pilot International President and Foundation Chair. Standing on the front portico on a very windy day in front of their fellow Pilots, Breaud filled a time capsule with the dedication program, a club key, a Pilot history book and DVD and a copy of the organization's code of ethics. Laura Keever gave a concise pilot history using the words of past presidents.

When the Heritage Garden is completed in the rear of the property, the capsule will be buried there. "I'm hoping it will stay in the ground for 63 years," said Breaud, citing the organizations 150th anniversary in 2071.

After the opening ceremony, members were able to take a self guided tour and see many of the artifacts dating back to the 1930's on display in the building's gallery. The creative services/media room in headquarters will have a plaque designating it as a donated gift from the Florida District.

Florida District had a proud day with seven past governors present: June Dupree, Jan Potter, Linda Holden, Dene Dixon, Winnie Brewer, Ann Freeman and Agatha Muse Salters. Approximately 25 Florida Pilots made the trip for this special occasion. The West Central Region had 12 Pilots who carpoled representing the clubs from Crystal River, Gulf to Lakes, Sumter County and Zephyrhills.

It was truly a homecoming as Pilots greeted each other and celebrated together. - Joan Midgett
